There won't be any dress or tack requirements to show in any event, as this is for everyone to have fun with their animals. However helmets are strongly recommended for the ridden events for adults and are required for any junior riders to participate. Also please do not bring or advertise any animals that are for sale, as this event is to help promote the BLM's adoption that is going on at the same time.
